Kevin Snider

Kevin Snider has been an attorney since 1994. During that time he has practiced primarily in the area of constitutional law and civil rights. Snider has litigated a number of cases which have garnered national attention. These include two in the U.S. Supreme Court – A Woman's Friend v. Kamala Harris and Gateway City Church v. Gavin Newsom.

He argued In re Jonathan L. before the California Court of Appeal which resulted in restoring the right to homeschool in California. In Michael Newdow v. LeFevre, he argued in defense of the national motto – In God We Trust – in front of the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals. Days before the January 2009 swearing in of President Obama, Snider represented Pastors Rick Warren and Joseph Lowery in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia in which he successfully argued against the request for an injunction to prevent the invocation and benediction at the inauguration.

He has been the Chief Counsel for the Pacific Justice Institute since 2004. He has been seen on CSPAN and CNN, has made dozens of radio and television appearances, and is interviewed frequently or quoted in newspaper and other publications. Snider is admitted to the Washington, California, and District of Columbia Bars. His wife, Chenyuan, is a regular contributing writer for The Stream. They have two children and reside in northern California.

The Current Landscape of Religious Liberties

What began as a sermon series then turned into a book, The One Another Project.



Wes Davis

I'm a follower of Jesus. A family man. A dreamer. A church planting junkie. And a basketball lover. My wife, Kari, and I launched a church 20 years ago in the Greater Seattle area that grew from 14 people in our living room to over 4000 people in 7 locations, 3 additional church plants, and 2000 people baptized (pre-COVID). Along the way our family grew to five kids and two grandchildren! My assignment from Jesus is to develop young leaders and launch churches. Don't we all dream of seeing a Jesus movement in our communities in our lifetime. Can you see it?

The Generation Gap in the Church: The Secret to Getting Different Generations On the Mission Together

1 million young people leave the church every year (including half the kids in our youth groups when they graduate). And many boomers and builders have raised their kids and are only passively involved in the church at a time when the have the most amount of wisdom and financial resources to make a difference.

Good news! This generation of young adults (ages 15-29 as defined by the study/book Growing Young) want mentors and are no longer looking for a church that is cool, but one that is warm! Could the next great awakening in America be as simple as getting the Young to see vision and the old to dream dreams together! Isn't that what it says in the book of Acts??

We live in a culture that worships the young but all the power is with the old. We live in a country where data suggests that the #1 implicit bias is Age (#2 Body shape, #3 Ethnicity). What if the church led the way in connecting all ages because the mission needs every generation!
